

for specifically the zero to three, or preschool, that we are going to make sure that in the first year of the next fiscal year, '95-96, that any deficits that would appear in that preschool portion, even if there is a cap, will be honored because we...we're going to go to the full funding of that. And so we're working with that and we're working with Sandy to make sure that we're consistent with what you're doing here with with what we may do as a body, if the body so chooses, on the special ed. So I just wanted to bring that to your attention so when we get to that special ed bill you can make sure that we don't have any inconsistencies from what...from what we're doing with this policy.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Madam President, I was just glancing through this and, Senator Wehrbein...

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Wehrbein.
