I'm ready to withdraw this amendment in light of the fact that I have a commitment from Game and Parks to visit the whole issue of what the public interest is and define it in a little broader sense than a geographical limitation of ten miles and then we will bring that amendment back for the bill, rather than dealing with this amendment at this time. And so, with that understanding and that commitment from Game and Parks, Mr. Speaker, if I could, I would withdraw this amendment at this time. Thank...
