I'm going to find out which audit but, once again, if a member or Senator Chambers, in this case, wants to know more, this information would be available through an audit trail on these funds if you wanted to pursue the right place and I will tell you where that will be in due time, Senator Chambers, but it's a lot of these things are available if you know where to look and to dig it out.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: It was in the DAS audit the last time, while I get that on the record. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. The question before the body is the advancement of LB 311. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 311.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 311 advances. LB 325.

CLERK: 325, a bill by Senator Warner at the request of the Governor. (Read title.) Bill was introduced on January 11, referred to the Appropriations Committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Madam President.
