SPEAKER WITHEM: All in favor say aye. Opposed. They are adopted. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Nothing further on 616, Senator.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Mr. Speaker, I'd move to advance LB 616 to E & R Final.

SPEAKER WITHEM: All in favor say aye. Opposed. It is advanced. LB 696.

CLERK: LB 696, Senator, I have no amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Mr. Speaker, I'd move to advance LB 696 to E & R for grossment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: All in favor say aye. Opposed. It is advanced. LB 207.

CLERK: Mr. President, on 207 no E & Rs. Senator Day would move to amend the bill.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Day.

SENATOR DAY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. This bill, if you remember, was allowing some of LB 840 money where the cities vote on using the money for economic developments and adding the fact in that they could use it for housing. There were a couple of questions on General File and this amendment is really just clarifying those questions. It is clarifying what low and moderate income housing would be which was something Senator Bernard-Stevens brought up and questioned. We also took out where it said that it could only be contractors that build houses of low and moderate income. We took that out so that any contractor could be involved in this which was a concern that Senator Wesely brought. So it basically does not change the intent of the bill at all. It just clarifies some things and some things that members had a question on. I'd urge your support of this amendment.
