

SENATOR LINDSAY: So if it's a felony...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But, Senator Lindsay, it doesn't say a crime, a similar crime in the other state of the kind envisioned by these Nebraska statutes. It says a similar statute.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So we don't know if that means it's talking about a crime of the same grade but just a similar statute. Or let's say that they define something as a felony in that state but it's not deemed a felony in Nebraska.

SENATOR LINDSAY: The...it would be...it's required earlier in the language for...if you look on page...of the green copy, page 15, line 25, if the felony committed is in violation. So it would require...that is what I'm saying is that earlier in the statute when I say the term "felony" is used, that, I think, requires that the felony be...or that the act or the violation of the other statute be a felony.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But that brings us right back where we are, I meant where I started. If one of the others was...we go on...are you on page 16?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Felony convictions was...one of the prior felony convictions...

SENATOR HALL: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...was for a violation of one of the sections listed in this subdivision or of a similar statute in another state.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now it doesn't say that the...here's what I'm trying to ask you. Are you aware that similar conduct may be considered a felony in one state but not another?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Yes.
