

SPEAKER WITHEM: Is there any discussion? Seeing none, the question is the adoption of the Wickersham amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Members your attention to the board would be appreciated if you'd care to vote. I would appreciate your recording your vote. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the amendment, Mr. President.

SENATOR WILL: Mr. Speaker, I would move for the advancement of LB 99 to E & R for engrossment.
