

but perhaps not. But I'm going to get you. You may get your crime bill tonight but they better put an amendment up there to make sure there cannot be any amendments to it on Final Reading and it doesn't have to come back. It will just take a long time and there are other bills that will take a long time. I'm looking at some bills that will allow that, like LB 592 which I really don't like anyway, and have some amendments to it, but there are others who don't like that bill. So maybe they're going to drop their opposition and maybe they won't, but I'm giving you notice of how I intend to do this. I don't have the votes to whip you on anything in a fair fight or an unfair fight. So I'm not even going to talk about fairness. That's out the window. We're at the time in the session where people become very innovative and creative, and you can do this. You can vote to say that this ought to be considered germane by overruling the Chair. You did not overrule the Chair on Senator Maurstad's amendment about the gun-free school zone. You didn't because you didn't like the amendment. But now, because you want to get out of here, you're going to vote to overrule the Chair when there is less relationship to what Senator Lindsay is offering than what Senator Maurstad offered. Just change the operative date. So you know what that means? That I can now offer my amendment to abolish the death penalty to this bill when it reaches Final Reading. And if you think I'm not as serious as a heart attack, here are the copies, and I will file it tonight. So if somebody wants to stop me from doing this, you better hurry up and get a motion up there saying that there can be no amendments or debate offered to LB 371 on Final Reading, you've got time to do it, but you better do it quickly. I'm telling you like Jesus told Judas, when people said, who is going to betray you? He said, the one that I give the sock to, and he gave it to Judas, and he said, what you do, you will do it...
