

SENATOR WILL: Senator Coordsen, on LR 259.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. Chairman, and members of the body, it is with a great amount of pleasure that I introduce to the Legislature LR 259 which commemorates the activities of a team of elementary school students, fourth, fifth and sixth grade, from Crete, Nebraska that entered in a national science competition, a national science competition, and won.
