We will then, when that cut-off on that time for that practice begins, we will then begin reading some of the bills on Final Reading and getting, hopefully, a good dent on some of the pending Final Reading bills. We're wanting to make sure that we don't make any mistakes on the agenda so it's going to be a little later getting out, but I know all of your hardworking staff members will be here tomorrow and they will be able to analyze it, get you copies of it and do...do whatever it takes. Thank you, Mr. President, for the opportunity to speak.
