PRESIDENT ROBAK: The amendment is adopted. Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Madam President, I move to advance LB 626 to E & R for engrossment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Any discussion? Seeing none, the question before you is the advancement of LB 626. All those in favor say aye. All those opposed nay. LB 626 advances. LB 752.

CLERK: (Read LB 752 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 752 pass? All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 2687 of the Legislative Journal.) 41 ayes, 0 nays, 2 present and not voting, 6 excused and not voting.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 752 passes. LR 3CA.

CLERK: Senator Kristensen would move to return the resolution.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Kristensen to open on his motion.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Madam President, members of the Legislature. The only purpose I have for doing this is, one, is to again explain that this is one of the constitutional amendments that was left off, or was removed from the ballot last November. This is one, I think, Senator Withem, this is the last remaining constitutional amendment that has not been placed back on. I believe most of the other ones were put on the general...or on the primary ballot. That requires 40 votes and, Madam President, I just want to make sure what the rules are, that we will take a vote for the 40 votes first to see if it is placed on the primary, is that correct?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: That is correct, Senator.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Okay, thank you very much, and would ask the body's indulgence. This is sort of one of the amendments we had left over from last November and would hope that we do, as
