PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Governor's veto is overridden.

CLERK: Senator Hall, I assume, Senator, your motion...you have a motion for the whole bill, Senator.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Withdraw.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: It is withdrawn. We now turn to legislative resolutions. LR 28. The Chair recognizes Senator Withem.

SPEAKER WITHEM: In the interest of time, I'm going to pass over LR 28 tonight and if there is time tomorrow when we're considering resolutions, it will be on that list.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LR 52. The Chair recognizes Senator Crosby.

SENATOR CROSBY: Madam Chairperson, Madam President,...don't go away, I'm trying to think of what I'm supposed to say. I will pass over my resolution tonight too.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: We're passing over LR 52. LR 81, Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Pass over that too, also, Madam Speaker.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: We are passing over LR 81. LR 104, Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Yes, I would like to pass over that too, please.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Jones, we pass over LR 104. LR 140, Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Madam President, and I wish I could do the same but several of us were asked by a number of Natural Resource Districts bordering the Platte River from Columbus to the mouth of the river by the Natural Resource Districts at the request of Congressman Bereuter to try to show whether or not the state would support the corridor study from Columbus to Plattsmouth and if there is an expression of support from the State of Nebraska, there may be a chance of getting some help out of the Corps of Engineers with the project in the near
