

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I withdraw that amendment and any others that I have up there at this point.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Are there any...that amendment is withdrawn. Anything further on the motion.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the motion, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The question then before the body, we are back to consideration of the, for lack of a better term, the Appropriations Committee override motion as it has been amended. Is there any further discussion? Senator Wehrbein, would you like to close.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 2765 of the Legislative Journal.) 33 ayes, 16 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to override the Governor's line-item vetoes as offered by the Appropriations Committee.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The motion is successful. Mr. Clerk, anything further on LB 392.

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President, Senator Hall has the first motion.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Hall.
