CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 214 of the Legislative Journal.) 6 ayes, 36 nays, Mr. President, on the amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The amendment is not adopted. The call is raised. Mr. Clerk, any items for the record?

CLERK: I do, Mr. President. New bills. (Read LB 1009-1028 by title for the first time. See pages 215-19 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, in addition to those items, new constitutional amendment proposals. (Read brief summary of LR 284-286. See pages 219-30 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, Senator Bernard-Stevens would like to print amendments to LB 624 and LB 642. And, Mr. President, Senator Robinson would like to add his name to LB 927, Senator Maurstad to LB 253A. (See pages 230-31 of the Legislative Journal.) That's all that I have at this time, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Hilgert, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR HILGERT: Mr. Speaker, I move that we recess until one-thirty.

SPEAKER WITHEM: You've heard the motion. All those in favor of recessing till one-thirty say aye. Opposed. We are in recess.
