Who have they mistreated to the extent that they ought to fear everybody? And yet a man who is supposed to be the devil incarnate, when they're giving me my just due that's what they say, doesn't carry weapons, doesn't have bodyguards, doesn't have secret buttons to call security, goes anywhere. This that I'm talking about is involved in this bill and what you all are being asked to do by the Governor, to dismantle the only hope for trying to change some things.
