SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, that's very interesting. And I think I'm going to watch the rest of discussion on this. But at this present time I, I intend on supporting this rules change. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Withem, your light is next. Seeing no further lights, the Chair recognizes Senator Will to close.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Madam President. This is closing?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Yes, Senator.

SENATOR WILL: I would assume I think we've had a very thorough discussion of, of this proposed change. Certainly I think that this clarifies a practice that actually as a practical matter is going on now as far as correlating and combining subject matters under one bill, within the jurisdiction of the, of the committee. And I think it simply, it's a, it's a wise thing to put into our rules to make sure that this is clarified, that it is something that is acceptable. And, certainly, I think it's within the province of a committee to act in that fashion. If Senator Withem has anything to add, I would give the remainder of my closing to him.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Withem, anything further? Senator says no. The question before the body is the adoption of the second proposed rule change. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 272 of the Legislative Journal.) 28 ayes, 7 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of the amendment as offered by the Rules Committee.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The second proposed rule change is adopted. Mr. Clerk, items for the record.
