I strongly suggest that we vote against 2751, which is the one-page amendment that we are, that is right now before us before we go on to amendment 2750, which I will vote for. But I will vote against 2751 prior to that time and urge you to leave the responsibility with the physicians who have the education to make the diagnosis, the critical factor brought out by both Senator Maurstad and Senator Bohlke. Thank you.
