SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Maurstad. You've heard the closing. The question is the adoption of the Maurstad amendment to this change in the permanent rules. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of Senator Maurstad's amendment to the proposed Rules Committee amendments.

SENATOR CROSBY: The amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk, do you have some things for the record?

CLERK: I do, Madam President, new bills. (Read LB 1162-1171 by title for the first time. See pages 363-65 of the Legislative Journal.)

Madam President, the next item I have by Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers would move to amend the Rules Committee amendment. The amendment is found on page 349 of the Journal. Senator, this is your amendment we had printed yesterday.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The "Lola" amendment?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What this amendment says is, whatever Lola wants...

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature.

SENATOR CROSBY: You're going to open on your amendment?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR CROSBY: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: "Whatever Lola wants, Lola gets. Lola shall mean whoever is Speaker." That's what you're doing with this kind of thing. You're giving everything away and I will not agree to it. But if it's going to be done let us do it in a clear, straightforward manner which all members of the public can understand and that is to say the Speaker is to be given a
