(Read by title for the first time.) Senator Chambers, amendments to 754; Senator Schellpeper to LR 43; Senator McKenzie to 754. All those to be printed. Hearing notice from Program Evaluation, it's signed by Senator Warner as Chair. And Senator Pirsch would like to add her name to 1380 and Senator Lynch to 694.
