bracket motion, rather than being the H.M.S. Hood is the torpedo that should sink LR 43CA. And because there might be some interest in this, the Bismarck was a huge battleship built by the Nazis in violation of a naval agreement with Britain, and they lied to Britain about the size of this ship. Now the contract was let November 16, 1935, the keel was laid July 1, 1936. It was launched February 14, 1939. It was commissioned August 24, 1940. And one thousand miles off coast it was sunk in May of 1941. I just thought I'd throw that in for the interest. And I hope you will vote yes on this bracket motion.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You heard the closing. The issue before the body is bracketing LR 43CA. Roll call vote has been requested. Mr. Clerk, call the roll.
