

February 7, 1996 LB 584, 890, 891

SENATOR COORDSEN: Yes, I do.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Maurstad is there. I am sorry, I didn't see you.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: I was in my seat right where I belong, Senator Crosby.

SENATOR CROSBY: You were hiding behind those books.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: I move to advance LB 584 to E & R for engrossment.

SENATOR CROSBY: You've heard the motion. Senator Beutler, did you wish to speak before we vote? You've heard the motion to advance LB 584 to E & R for engrossing. All in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is advanced. We will return to Final Reading. Senators, you should be in your seats for Final Reading, and our next bill is LB 890.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 890 on Final Reading.)

SENATOR CROSBY: All requirements...all provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 890 pass? All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 727 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 37 ayes, 0 nays, 4 present and not voting, 8 excused and not voting.

SENATOR CROSBY: LB 890 passes. Before we continue to the next bill, I'd like to mention Senator Dierks has as his guests in the north balcony Lauren Hiebner from O'Neill and Jean Crumly from the public schools in O'Neill with twelve students. Will you please rise and be welcomed by your Legislature. LB 891, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 891 on Final Reading.)

SENATOR CROSBY: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 891 pass? All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please.
