it. And that isn't, as I said, not a big concern. I just wanted to make sure that I wasn't unaware of something that would prohibit somebody from charging for these services. So thank you for your answers.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Maurstad. Any further discussion on the advancement of LB 1055? Seeing none, Senator Schmitt, to close. Closing is waived. The question before you is the advancement of LB 1055. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of the motion to advance LB 1055.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 1055 advances.

CLERK: Madam President, if I may, items.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Items for the record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Government Committee reports LB 982 to General File with amendments; and LB 1243 as indefinitely postponed; those signed by Senator Robinson. Explanation of vote for Senator Pedersen (re. LB 939 and LB 949). Senator Landis, amendments to LB 1275; and Senator Hartnett to LB 1057. And bills read on Final Reading, Friday, (re. LB 584, LB 939 and LB 949) have been presented to the Governor, Madam President. (See pages 908-10 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We turn now to LB 681.

CLERK: LB 681, Madam President, a bill introduced by Senator Kristensen. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 19, referred to the Banking, Commerce, and Insurance Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending by the Banking Committee.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Landis to open on the committee amendments.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Madam President, members of the Legislature. This is the Limited Liability Partnership Act. Senator Kristensen brought this bill to the committee, and the committee made three recommended changes which appear in your
