

also record. If it's mobile, and practically all of it is now, it has to record the speed of the vehicle. It subtracts the speed of the vehicle from the speed of the cruiser, plus that of the oncoming car. That's what it has to do, and it has to take out the speed of the vehicle, it has to take out the cruiser's speed. And what is left...

SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute left on Senator Klein's time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...is supposed to be the speed of the oncoming vehicle. But these things are not always accurate, because the amount of inflation in the tires, these radar devices have to be adjusted. There are all kinds of things that can cause these readings to be erroneous. So if the committee thought, by putting any language in the bill, they were going to require officers to write a ticket if somebody is one or two miles over the limit, that was a waste of time. That will not be done and it cannot stand up in court. So we can forget about this thing of strict enforcement. And, Senator Wehrbein, I don't believe more officers will be put on road patrol. Nothing is going to change. People drive at a comfortable rate for themselves and they'll continue to do that, despite what the limit is. What it's going to do is put some people in a position where they can go faster than they ordinarily go without violating the speed limit,...

SPEAKER WITHEM: Time. Senator Chambers, you're recognized to continue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...without missing a beat, such as myself. Most people who drive back and forth between Omaha and Lincoln have, long ago, realized that I usually don't drive the maximum limit allowed, I usually don't. Now if there's glare ice and a strong wind blowing in front of me, I drive even slower. But you won't find me being the one who is the pacesetter. If I had someplace to be and a short time to get there, that equals jet propulsion. I'm...I didn't know that Senator Witek's license plate had my initials in front of her number, E-C. And what made me notice it, I saw this E-C whiz past me, and I said, wait a minute, that person looks familiar. And then she got slowed down in some traffic, and ambling along, like I do, I came close enough to see why this is Senator Witek. And she will tell you that she rips past me often. (Laughter.) 'Cause Senator Witek is a person with things to do and places to be, but she's not a
