

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: That's on Wickersham's amendment.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Well, Senator, I don't know, I'm going to have to come over there and read what you're reading from. But the amendment that I'm offering says to offer such services as they may perform at their level of certification insofar as...
