SENATOR COORDSEN: The report is adopted. CLERK: Mr. President, some items for the record if I might. Urban Affairs Committee reports LB 1017 as indefinitely postponed and LB 1237 as indefinitely postponed. Appropriations Committee reports LB 1120 to General File; LB 1382 to General File; LB 1189, General File with amendments, and; LB 1190, General File with amendments. In addition to those items, Mr. President, amendments: Senator Wesely to LB 1055; Senator Witek, LB 964; Senator Withem to LB 1205; Senator Warner to LB 1039; and the Appropriations Committee to LB 1189. I have a resolution offered by the Appropriations Committee, that'll be laid over, LR 335, and a new A bill, Mr. President, LB 1190A by Senator Wehrbein, as Chair of the Appropriations.
