This language is so vague that it could not possibly stand muster as a legitimate criminal statute, and that's what you're creating here, a criminal statute. My amendment would strike some of the obnoxious language, but what I am going to do, Mr. President...Mr. President.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Yes, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I am going to withdraw my amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The amendment is withdrawn. Before we proceed, I would like to announce that Senator Robinson has guests in the north balcony, 30 students, third through eighth grade from Burt County Home School, Tekamah, Nebraska with their teacher. Would you please rise and let us extend our appreciation to you for being with us this morning. Thank you. Next speaker on the Witek amendment, Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you. Mr. President, members of the body, I rise to oppose the Witek amendment. This particular one, Senator Witek, the next one I think has some merit, but, Senator Chambers, I am glad you withdrew your amendment because I don't think you could fix this one. And for all the reasons that you have mentioned, I can't support this amendment. I do think that Senator Chambers has drawn many interesting questions for you to think about. You know, my first instinct on this one was, gosh, I don't think the Girl Scouts are going to be able to sell cookies door to door during this period of time. I mean there is all kinds of implications that I don't think are well thought out. I think Senator Chambers is exactly right, that I think it could be called into question whether a family member could discuss the political issues with another family member, and I certainly think that that is an unintended result of this. I think that if you want to do something along this line, I think it is going to be difficult because I think there will be constitutional issues, but this certainly isn't the right language. This certainly raises far more questions than solves anything that Senator Witek wants to solve. So I would just urge that you vote against the Witek amendment.
