SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...through the Educational Service Unit, and that would share the cost with other school systems. So that...the burden doesn't necessarily fall on the one school system. Secondly, with reference to your questions about training and all that kind of thing, as I mentioned a little bit earlier, there is a training program that has been established at the University of Nebraska, so it's not like you're starting from scratch here. And so that...that would be probably where a lot of teachers would go to get either the additional in-service hours that they needed, or the basic training that they needed.

SENATOR AVERY: The equipment that we're trying to appropriate some one-time dollars for, that doesn't exist in Nebraska? There isn't that equipment? My understanding, there may be some at the university that could be utilized.
