SENATOR PIRSCH: So you just have to go to court and...

SENATOR LINDSAY: Right.

SENATOR PIRSCH: ...and...

SENATOR LINDSAY: And we've had that, as you and I both know, we've had, I think last year we put a jailer from the metropolitan class, county or district, what it would be, size six county or whatever, onto the Jail Standards Board just for that reason, that the Jail Standards Board wasn't always...

SENATOR PIRSCH: So there's some kind of input then with...

SENATOR LINDSAY: Right.

SENATOR PIRSCH: ...with that.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Right.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you very much.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Lindsay, no further lights on. Do you have a closing? Closing is waived. Question is, shall LB 233 advanced? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 233.

SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 233 advances. There is an A bill that did not get published on the agenda. We will move to LB 233A.

CLERK: (LB) 233A, introduced by Senator Lindsay. (Read title.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Lindsay, you care to open on your motion?

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. This would appropriate dollars to the Jail Standards Board for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of LB 233. It's a big one, it's \$1,400. So I'm going to ask you to look very closely at it, and then I would urge that the bill be advanced.
