CLERK: Mr. President, study resolution by Senator Jensen, LR 359, will be referred to the board. Senator Lindsay has amendments to LB 1249 to be printed; Senator Chambers to LB 1118. (See pages 1398-99 of the Legislative Journal.) A reminder, Mr. President, Senator Wehrbein would like to remind the membership that at one o'clock today there will be an informational meeting with respect to LB 1190 discussed last evening, 1190 at one o'clock in Room 1510, Room 1510. Thank you, Mr. President. That's all that I have.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you. Senator Preister has asked for a machine vote. The vote will be all those in favor of recessing until 1:30 will vote aye, those that do not wish to recess until that time will vote nay. Have you all voted? Senator Dierks has asked for a call of the house. All of those in favor of the house going under call vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 7 nays to place the house under call.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: The house is under call. Would all senators please report to the floor. Would all unauthorized staff and personnel please leave the floor at this time. The house is under call. We are voting on whether to recess until 1:30. The house is under call. Senator Bohlke, would you check in, please. Senator Robak, would you check in, please. Senator Warner, the house is under call. Senator Witek, would you check in, please. Senator Wesely, the house is under call. Senator Warner, could we have you check in, please. We're still looking for one member, Senator Robinson. Senator Dierks, we do not know where Senator Robinson is. Maybe by his absence that will be a silent green, I'm not sure. Do you want to continue? Senator Dierks has authorized the vote. The question is, shall we recess until 1:30 or shall we not? All those in favor of recessing will vote aye. The Clerk has corrected the chair. We have voted at this point so we can either take call-in votes, Senator, or a roll call vote. He has asked for a roll call. Mr. Clerk will call the roll.
