SPEAKER WITHEM: Good morning, ladies and gentlemen. Welcome to the George W. Norris Legislative Chamber, as we begin today, the fifty-first day of the Ninety-Fourth Legislature, Second Session. We're very pleased to have the chaplain for the day, Pastor Charles Tyler, who is retired, from Omaha. Lives in Senator Pirsch's district.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Pastor, very much. Members, please record your presence.

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Quorum is present. Are there any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: No corrections, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Are there any messages, reports or announcements?

CLERK: Mr. President, I have neither messages, reports nor announcements this morning.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Then we will move to General File consent calendar. Consent calendar rules are in effect. Mr. Clerk, LB 1213.

CLERK: LB 1213 by Senator Pirsch. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 16 of this year, referred to the Government Committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Pirsch, I'm sorry.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the body. LB 1213 was introduced at the request of the Nebraska Commission of Law Enforcement & Criminal Justice. The Crime Commission's executive director is Allen Curtis, who brought this to me. LB 1213 requires that the full out-of-pocket cost or expense for forensic medical examinations be paid by the primary
