SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I assume, Senator Bromm, because your son was on the basketball team and you did the resolution, there'd probably be a potential conflict of interest form filed yet today. That was kind of...that's really taking advantage of the system to promote your poor son. No, I just kid you. The first resolution I have congratulates the University of Nebraska at Kearney women's team, who had an undefeated conference this year. They also won the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference championship and qualified for the national tournament. They set a school record for number of wins this year and certainly deserve our congratulations and would like to do so. The second resolution I have congratulates the UNK men's basketball team, whose coach won his 500th game this year. They also qualified for the national tournament, which is unique that both teams in their first year in the conference qualified for the national title and, by the way, the UNK men gave the eventual national champions, who was only the third undefeated national championship team in Division II history, the UNK men played them the closest of any teams in the country, that included the national tournament team, only losing by three points. Certainly want to give them our congratulations for successful seasons and hopefully Senator Bromm's son may be good enough to play for UNK when he reaches college level. With that, I'd ask the body's adoption of these two resolutions. Thank you.
