

CLERK: I'm sorry.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Is that the original amendment that I had?

CLERK: It's a floor amendment. Yes, it's the original, I'm sorry, yes. (See FA484 on page 1029 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR MAURSTAD: I would ask that that be withdrawn if it's all right with the cointruder of the amendment, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR CROSBY: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Madam President, the last amendment I have is by Senator Robinson. I have a note now that he wishes to withdraw the amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Senator, I have nothing further pending on LB 1322.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Madam President, I'd move to advance LB 1322 to E & R for engrossment.
