LB 1044, 1268

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Landis. Senator Lindsay, do you have a closing? Closing has been waived. The question before the body is, shall LB 1268 be advanced? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 1268.

SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 1268 advances. Mr. Clerk, do you have any items for the record?

CLERK: The lobby report for this week, Mr. President. That's the only item. (See Report of Registered Lobbyists found on page 1623 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: The next item is Final Reading. Members, please take your seats and check in. We are on Final Reading. Members, would you please check in. The board is now open and we are on Final Reading. Senator Lynch, Senator Matzke, could you check in, please. Senator Bohlke, Senator Brashear, Senator Pedersen, Senator Robinson, Senator Schellpeper, Senator Schimek, Senator Cudaback, Senator Dierks, and Senator Engel. Senator Fisher and Senator Warner. For whom are we waiting, Mr. Clerk? Senator Cudaback and Senator Dierks, we are on Final Reading. While we're waiting, an announcement. Back by popular demand this year are the kolaches passed out to celebrate Senator Wesely's birthday. If you remember, Senator Wesely's mother last year took the year off and there I think a resolution was passed requesting that they be returned, so very definite congratulations to Senator Wesely. A lot of people thought the way he'd been behaving lately he wouldn't make it through the year, but congratulations, Senator Wesely, and very special thanks to his mother. We will proceed at this point.

CLERK: (Read LB 1044 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1044e pass with the emergency clause attached? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 1624 of the Legislative Journal.) 33 ayes, 13 nays, 1 present not voting, 2 excused and not voting, Mr. President.
