balance which we put it at \$100,000, it is possible...won't know at this point yet...that...by the way, this is appropriated for Legislative Council and would under the...the whole bill, as you will recall, is under the supervision of the Exec Board. But the additional \$100,000 is in because it is conceivable that at the end of the report that will be made this...the initial report when that is made, that one might want to go out for a RFP request proposal for implementing a model. Those kinds of costs range, depending upon the detail and the complexity, but it might range anywhere from \$50,000 to \$100,000, again putting in the maximum amount that we think might occur next year. I certainly might want to...or whoever is here may want to reduce that amount as RFPs tend to reflect the cost that you know is appropriated, but for the purposes at this time at least, we felt it was appropriate to put in what we think would be the maximum cost, with the assumption that it could be reduced, but I didn't want to come in next year and ask for an increase. I would ask that the bill be advanced. Five thousand at the most is all that's going to be needed, I would imagine, this year, and then we may be able to reduce it when that report is made and we know whether or not an RFP is likely to be significantly less.
