

forward. I think that's a wiser way to go. It continues the project, but we also send the right message right now that we're not going to put all of the pressure on political subdivisions and, oh, by the way, as the headlines kind of indicated today, we're going to spend some money on ourselves. I don't think that's the message we want to do. I agree with Senator Coordsen tremendously on his leadership on the Executive Board. I like the way he's going. This is another alternative and I think it will work as well and I would appreciate the body's support for the reconsideration.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Closing, that was the closing on the motion to reconsider the adoption of the Coordsen amendment to LB 1189. All of those favor in the reconsideration motion vote aye, opposed vote nay. Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Let's do a call of the house and a...

SPEAKER WITHEM: Question before the body is,...

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: ...and a roll call vote.

SPEAKER WITHEM: ..shall the house go under call? All of those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 0 nays to place the house under call.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The house is under call. Members, please return to the Chamber, record your presence. Unauthorized parties, leave the floor. The house is under call. Senator Lindsay, Senator Matzke, Senator Maurstad, Senator McKenzie, Senator Brashear, Senator Bromm. Senator Will, Senator Jones. Senator Matzke and Senator Matzke. Senator Bernard-Stevens, they've indicated they're having difficulty finding Senator Matzke. Okay, Mr. Clerk, a quick roll call vote, or a regular speed roll call vote, whichever you prefer. We are voting, by the way, on the Bernard-Stevens motion to reconsider the Coordsen amendment that was adopted last time the bill was under consideration.
