SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Hudkins. There are no other lights on. Did you have anything that you wish to say in closing? The question before the body is the return to Select File of LB 256. Those in favor of the return please vote aye, those opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The bill is returned to Select File. Senator Hudkins to open on your amendment.

SENATOR HUDKINS: I'll open very quickly, thank you, Mr. President. The amendment is showing who will pay for the costs of the person who is accused and who is found incompetent to stand trial. The amendment says that the costs will be shared equally by the county in which the person is charged and the state. Thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you. There are no other lights on. Did you think of anything you would like to say in closing? Thank you. Closing is waived. The question before the body is the adoption of the Hudkins amendment to LB 256. Those in favor please vote aye, those opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Hudkins' amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The Hudkins amendment is adopted. Senator Maurstad, would you like to make an amendment...make a motion?

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Mr. President, I move to advance LB 256 to E & R for engrossment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: You've heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. The bill is advanced. The next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Hudkins would move to return the bill, (LB) 256A, for AM4258, Senator.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Hudkins to open on your motion to return 256A.
