(Laughter) I move that the Journal for the sixtieth day, as prepared by the infamous Clerk of the Nebraska Legislature, who from time to time calls members middle-aged when they don't believe they are, be approved and that the Ninety-Fourth Legislature, Second Session of the Nebraska Legislature, having finished all business before it, now at, and I get my glasses on, two forty-two on April 18, 1996, adjourn sine die.
