SPEAKER WITHEM: Is there any discussion? Senator Cudaback, you're recognized to close. I must say I'm disappointed in the body in letting an opportunity like that go by without...but you were recognized to close. Closing's been waived. The question before the body is the withdrawal of LB 468. All of those in favor of withdrawing LB 468 vote aye, opposed vote nay. You're ready to record? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to withdrawn LB 468.

SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 468 is withdrawn. Would announce that we will be basically standing at ease for a short time this morning to allow bills that have...senators want to get filed today to be brought in, but I do not anticipate session lasting much beyond 11 o'clock today. The Pages, at this moment you may notice, are distributing muffins. It is because one of our members is having a birthday today.
