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SENATOR CUDABACK: If you and Jerry are disabled, work for the same company and issued this car,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Um-huh.

SENATOR CUDABACK: ...then you could...or that company could receive a plate for that particular automobile. But they can't just go down and say, I want five plates, absolutely not. You, Senator Chambers, must be the driver of that car, you must be, or you're in violation of the law.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But how would that keep the corporation from letting other people who are not disabled use the car so that they could easily park very near whatever establishment they have to go to?

SENATOR CUDABACK: That car is checked out to that person at the time, I guess if you want to break the law...currently, if I want to jump in your automobile and drive it with a sticker on it, I could do it currently. I guess if you have cheaters, I guess people may find a way around the law. As we all know, we can at times. But the same statute covers that from happening as exists currently. So we did not change that law. You're still breaking the law, if you are caught doing it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: In this case will the punishment be imposed on the company?

SENATOR CUDABACK: It would be imposed on the company, yes. That's the way I...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If a person who should not...who is not authorized to drive that car drives it, then the company is the one that will be punished.

SENATOR CUDABACK: My interpretation, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And how will the company be punished?
