SENATOR C. PETERSON: You had mentioned that it is not...we are not able to sell sausage or products that are made from game animals because of possibilities of problems with food processing. On page 3, 6, Section 6, it says game lawfully acquired from a licensed game farm may be sold in this state. How will that...

SENATOR HUDKINS: My mistake, this is from individuals with their hunting permits. Game from a game farm is an exception.

SENATOR C. PETERSON: Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Peterson. Senator Beutler, do you have a comment?

SENATOR BEUTLER: A quick comment. Senator, I wanted to let you know that Senator Wickersham has a mountain sheep bill, which would legalize the hunting of mountain sheep, which would affect your bill, and so I have scheduled it for hearing as soon as...as quickly as we could, but you might want to think about holding the bill on Select so we can amend in the material that would then become relevant from the mountain sheep bill and proceed with one bill, just so to let you know that that's happening.

SENATOR HUDKINS: Thank you for that information. If we may allow this to go on to Select, I would be perfectly willing to combine the bills at that time.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you. There are no further lights on. Senator Hudkins, do you have a closing? Closing is waived. The question is, shall LB 107 be advanced? All of those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.
