Supreme Court judges that go and undo our state Supreme Court's interpretation using these special legislation clause and say, there isn't equal protection in here. That's the fear, that's the reason, before that problem occurs, you put it in there. That's the fear and that's the reason we want to do it. I want to leave you with some procedure. And, Senator Dierks, I really do have some compassion for the concern for the number of amendments. And it's a process, it's the reason we review, every 20 years, this constitution. Not all those changes are things that you probably want to do, they're recommendations. But you need to look at them and you don't need to dismiss them out of hand. But I would hope, and what I'd like to do, and I would hope that my colleagues, Senator Warner and Senator Withem, would approve of this and I plan to discuss with them, move these to Select File, providing they're acceptable to the body, at least in the first round of debate. You don't like the policy, vote against it. Move these over to Select File and begin to prioritize them. Some of them you may want to go in the primary, some of them you may not want to do at all, some you may want to go in the general. But get the broad view first. Let's prioritize them on Select File. Let's don't try to run them through by the end of February. Those elections are two years off. Then at that point in time we can prioritize them, at that point in time we can decide if we want to combine some and have separate votes, and maybe we just want to walk away from all of them. But give you a chance to look at all of them so you don't have to do this on a piece-by-piece basis. If we weren't making the changes in Article III, Section 18, I doubt if we'd...
