SENATOR CUDABACK: Mine is there also, but Senator Beutler's is there also, too. Then it goes on and strikes "and in lines 10 through 12".

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. But the point that we want to make clear is that when the term "nonresident" is used, it merely means nonresident of the county, not a nonresident of the state. Is that correct?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, thank you. That's all I wanted to be sure was in the record.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Yes, yeah, sure. I'm glad you pointed that out. Nonresident, yeah right.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Okay, thank you. There are no other lights on. Senator Cudaback, did you wish to close on your amendment? Closing is waived. The issue before the body is the adoption of the Cudaback amendment to LB 71. We are voting on the Cudaback amendment to LB 71. If you care to vote, please do so. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Cudaback's amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Senator Bruning, I have nothing further on the bill.

SENATOR BRUNING: Mr. President, I move LB 71 to E & R for engrossing.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Motion is to advance LB 71 to E & R for engrossing. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. The bill is advanced. Next item, LB 16, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: LB 16, Senator, I have no amendments to the bill.

SENATOR BRUNING: Mr. President, I move to advance LB 16 to
