SENATOR COORDSEN: Motion is to advance LB 16 to E & R for engrossment. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. Bill is advanced. Next item, LB 62.

CLERK: LB 62, Senator, I have no amendments to the bill.

SENATOR BRUNING: I move to advance LB 62 to E & R for engrossing.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The motion is to advance LB 62 to E & R for engrossment. All those in favor please say aye. Opposed nay. The bill is advanced. Next item LB 113, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, with respect to 113, no E & R. Senator Jensen would move to amend the bill. Senator, I have AM0215 in front of me. (Amendment can be found on page 542 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR JENSEN: Mr. President, members of the body, this amendment, which is being passed out right now, simply adds one sentence, which is the last sentence on line 12. It says "The tax commissioner shall make annual reports to the Legislature of the cost incurred and the revenue received in the implementation of this subsection." All I want to do is find out what it is costing to collect these dollars and the amount that is being collected. It should be good policy for any bill that is proposed before us. That's the extent of the amendment, just that one sentence. If you have any questions, I'd be glad to answer them.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Wehrbein. Question on the Jensen amendment.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. Speaker, members. I don't know whether it's appropriate at this time to comment, but I happened to hear something over the weekend, and maybe some of you did, about this particular issue, based on the National Governors Conference going on in Washington, D.C.
