PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN: Madam President, members of the body, Legislative Resolution 68 is to recognize the fourth grade classes from Westgate Elementary School in Omaha and Kahoa Elementary School in Lincoln, who have shown support for the reconstruction of the Capitol. They came before the Appropriations Committee in December to testify about their great regard for this beautiful building that we work in, and they also challenged all the other fourth grade classes in the state of Nebraska to get involved in raising funds. The students from Kahoa have developed a program where they are making friendship bracelets and selling them for a dollar a piece and the proceeds are going towards the Capitol reconstruction, and the students in Westgate are just raising money from people in the community to support the Capitol. And the youngsters were very effective lobbyists and very effective citizens of the state of Nebraska in their support of this wonderful building. And this resolution is in their honor.
