CLERK: LR 50, Madam President, introduced by Senator Wehrbein. (Read brief explanation. See page 311 of the Legislative Journal.) The resolution was introduced in January of this year, referred to the Natural Resources Committee for public hearing. The resolution is now back before the Legislature for further consideration.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Madam Speaker and members, I think there was a handout from Senator Beutler on this. This is a plot of ground, about 11 acres. It is out near...excuse me, 7.63 acres out near the entrance to Mahoney Park. This is a gift of ground. It has come from the foundation and will be used in the area of the entrance of the Mahoney State Park. My understanding is that it's to be used as part of the landscape...landscaping to the entrance there. If have you been there, or as you go Interstate 80 to Omaha, remind you to look over that way. The Air Force Museum is going in there west of the Mahoney State Park. This plot of ground will contribute to the landscaping value in that area and it's a gift for us to except, and this is the reason for the resolution.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Is there any discussion on the advancement of LR 50? Seeing none, Senator Wehrbein, do you wish to close?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Just simply to say we thank the foundation for this gift to the state, and this is the formality for us to accept it, and I urge your consideration. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. The question before the body is the adoption of LR 50. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of LR 50.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LR 50 is adopted. LR 79.
