PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Is there any further discussion of the committee amendments? Seeing none. Senator Hartnett waives closing. The question before you is the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 426. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of committee amendments.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Committee amendments are adopted. Is there any discussion on the bill? Seeing none. Senator Cudaback, to close. Closing is waived. The question before you is the advancement of LB 426. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 426.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 426 advances. LB 666.

CLERK: LB 666, by Senator Lynch. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 22, referred to Urban Affairs, advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending. (Committee amendment AMO287 found on page 579 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Lynch to open on the bill.

SENATOR LYNCH: First of all, I hope that most of you are not superstitious enough to worry about a bill with the number 666, but since I'm the senator from Legislative District 13, it doesn't bother me, so I hope it doesn't bother you. But this applies to cities of the metropolitan class, the primary class, cities, first class, second, and also the cities and villages and... It simply changes one word from "shall" to "may", and it applies to bonds. The law now provides that all plumbing
