PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 666 advances. We are now out of consent calendar. Mr. Clerk, items for the record.

Some of those having Enrollment and Review amendments attached. In addition, Madam President, I have reports from the Transportation Committee. LB 226 is reported to General File. Banking Committee reports (LB) 152 to General File, (LB) 273 to General File with committee amendments attached. Urban Affairs will have an Executive Session immediately in Room 2022. Urban Affairs in Room 2022 now. (See pages 626-28 of the Legislative Journal.) Madam President, LR 5 was the resolution originally introduced by Senator Stuhr. (Read brief summary.) The resolution was introduced on January 9. At that time it was referred to the Government Committee. The resolution has been discussed on the floor on January 27 and 28. It failed to advance on the 28th. The first motion I have this morning with respect to LR 5 is one by Senators Stuhr and Maurstad, AM0093. (Found on page 459 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Stuhr to open on the motion.

SENATOR STUHR: Thank you, Madam President and members of the body. I do not intend to spend a great deal of time on this issue since we have discussed it in length for several days. What the amendment does is change back...or addresses the Beutler amendment which increased the length of the Legislative Session from 80 to 85. This amendment puts it back to the 90-day session. An I know that there was considerable debate on that...keeping the length of the session as it now is. So, that is actually what this amendment does. It still retains the early starting session in December. And that also had been amended to a three day session. Not more than three days, and that would be beginning on the fifth Wednesday. So I ask for your support on this amendment.
