CLERK: I have nothing further on the resolution, Senator.

SENATOR BRUNING: I move LR 32CA to E & R for engrossing.

SENATOR CROSBY: You've heard the motion to advance LR 32CA to E & R for engrossment. All in favor say aye. Opposed no. It is advanced. Mr. Clerk, do you have items for the record?

CLERK: I do, Madam President, thank you. Your Committee on Banking, Commerce and Insurance, chaired by Senator Landis, reports LB 51 to General File, (LB) 54 General File with amendments, (LB) 327 General File with amendments, and (LB) 89 indefinitely postponed. Enrollment and Review reports LB 631, (LB) 199, (LB) 453, (LB) 184, (LB) 325 to Select File, some of which have Enrollment and Review amendments attached. And I have a series of hearing notices from the Revenue Committee, Business and Labor Committee, and...two from the Business and Labor Committee, signed by their respective chairs. That's all that I have, Madam President. Thank you. (See pages 699-702 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We will proceed to General File, LB 114A.

CLERK: Madam President, LB 114A, bill originally introduced by Senator Landis. (Read title.) That was introduced earlier this year.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Madam President, members of the Legislature. This bill was given to me by the Legislative Fiscal Office. (LB) 114 is a change in our public accountancy law. One of the changes that we made was to raise the per diem for members who serve on the Public Accountancy Board. It raises from \$50 to \$ 00. It was set at \$50 in 1957. Our Real Estate Appraisal Board and our Real Estate...there are two boards in the real estate area that are paid \$100 a day. This, which is a cash-funded expenditure based on the fees that are paid by accountants raises about \$16,000 in one year and \$18,000 in another, and I would ask for the advancement of LB 114A.
