At this time, I would like to withdraw that amendment, please.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Seeing no objections, the amendment is withdrawn. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Elmer. AM531, Senator, in front of me. (See pages 741-44 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Elmer.

SENATOR ELMER: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Members, this amendment is embodied in the green copy of LB 416, which was heard by the Natural Resources Committee last week, and it's basically a clean-up amendment relative to replacement water wells. And merely puts into sync the paperwork that is required of people that construct replacement water wells in the Department of Water Resources, with the well drillers providing the information necessary for those wells. It's a bill that has been worked out in cooperation with the Nebraska Well Drillers Association and Department of Water Resources, and is in full consensus. It's basically a consent calendar type bill. And we thought we could save the body considerable time by adopting it to Senator Beutler's LB 30. I would ask for your help in adopting the amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: There are no other lights on. Senator Elmer, did you wish to say anything in closing? Closing is waived. The issue before the body is the adoption of the Elmer amendment to LB 30. All in favor please vote aye, all opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Elmer's amendment to the bill.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The Elmer amendment is adopted. Anything further on the bill?

CLERK: Senator Elmer, you want your second motion, Senator? Senator Elmer would move to indefinitely postpone.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Beutler, the motion is to
