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use the telephone. Believe it or not, I still get a little flak, and that's hard to believe, because for me when we first did that, that was a real step forward for these people to be able to communicate. So I still don't know, I voted the other day for your amendment, Senator Chambers. I don't like the Bohlke amendment at all. I don't know why we are involving the whole state in this to settle something that has happened and is working and is happening in...

SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute.

SENATOR CROSBY: ...Omaha, which I assume after May, when we find out who your mayor is and so on, maybe this question will be resolved in a different way. So I don't know how I am going to vote if we ever get to a vote on the bill. I am little concerned about your amendment right now, Senator Chambers, although I am trying to pay attention because I do think we do this here regularly. My constituents didn't say they wanted any kind of replacement taxes for property taxes. They said they wanted lower property taxes, but when we run things like this in and we do it on drivers' licenses, we do it in all kinds of ways, when we run a fee like this in, or an extra charge on a bill of this kind, we are raising people's taxes, and that's one of the reasons I am being really careful on this bill because I don't... I am trying really hard...

SPEAKER WITHEM: Time, Senator.

SENATOR CROSBY: ...not to vote for anything that will raise people's taxes in any way. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABLLOUD: Thank you, Mr. President. As I said when we began this today, it would probably take quite awhile. It won't be too cantankerous but certainly will give us a full and thorough debate of the 911 system and public safety in general, and I think we've certainly accomplished that. I am going to talk a little bit about some of the issues that have been raised about elderly, and I recall earlier this session, I signed onto a bill with Senator Hilgert, LB 530, that clearly provided a good property tax relief for the elderly, and it was my intent
