that and would hope that all of you are cognizant of the impact that such suits have on our budget. And with that, I would certainly support this. It's absolutely necessary. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator. Senator Wehrbein, you're recognized to close on the motion to advance.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Very simply, thank you for your time and I certainly concur with what Senator Elmer said, that this does have potential ramifications in other areas, and the body needs to understand and keep that mind as we move forward. This one, we have been successful, and I'd urge you to keep us on the forefront of this as we move forward in this lawsuit. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The question before the body now then is, shall LB 887 be advanced to E & R Initial? All in favor vote aye. Opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 887.

SPEAKER WITHEM: (LB) 887 is advanced. Mr. Clerk, items for the record?

CLERK: Mr. President, thank you. New A bill. (Read LB 327A by title for the first time.) Priority bill designations: Senator Suttle has selected (LB) 301, Senator Bruning has selected LB 422. Health and Human Services Committee reports LB 340 to General File with committee amendments attached. Senator Robak would like to print amendments to LB 138. That's all that I have, Mr. President.
